

Inside the President's Circle





2020 will be a year of many changes at Siena College including the selection of the 12th president in our history.

The executive search profile generated approximately 80 applications from candidates working in higher education leadership positions across the country. The depth and quality of the pool speaks to Siena's national reputation and potential for sustained success. RH Perry and Associates sorted the applications by tiers, with the top tier – just over 20 percent of the pool – representing the most qualified candidates.

Those profiles have been shared with the College's presidential search committee – a 15-person group comprised of trustees, faculty, and campus leaders. The committee is in the process of refining the pool of candidates into a short list. Background checks have already begun, but more thorough vetting will commence once the list has been narrowed further.

As originally planned, Siena expects to name our next president by mid to late March, at which point we will plan an on-campus introduction for the entire community, followed by a formal inauguration in the fall.

John Murray '79, Chair of the Siena College Board of Trustees and Tom Baldwin '81, Vice Chair of the Siena College Board of Trustees and Chair of the Presidential Search Committee released the following statement, "The committee is charged with selecting the person best able to boldly advance a strategic vision that ensures a thriving future for Siena, someone who recognizes the challenges within the market, and someone with great appreciation for the intrinsic value of our Catholic and Franciscan education. We are very encouraged by the pool of candidates, and have no doubt that our committee will select a very worthy leader to be named the 12th president of Siena College."

Pope Francis Welcomes Siena College

Siena students traveling in Italy on a class pilgrimage spent their last day attending the Angelus prayer in St. Peter's Square at the Vatican. From his balcony overlooking the world-famous square, Pope Francis welcomed "students from the Franciscan Institution at Siena College in New York."

The 33 students began their trip Dec. 27, part of the special topics class "Italy Travel – Franciscan Leadership" led by Fr. Mark Reamer, O.F.M., D. Min., Siena's vice president for mission. In addition to Rome and the Vatican, the group visited Florence, Cortina, Siena (the original!) and Assisi.

Senior Gift 2020 Project: The Bells of Remembrance

The Holy Name Province in NYC is the home of the Franciscan Friars, including many of our Siena friars; but it has also been the home to a collection of bells. These bells have great meaning, and have been used to celebrate momentous

events in the life of Holy Name Province. The largest of the bells came to prominence on 9/11, and the memorials that followed, and was known as the "Firefighter's Bell". This bell was rung

> for 10 years on the anniversary of 9/11 until the permanent memorial was completed.

Three of these bells have been gifted to Siena in memory of Br. Ed Coughlin, OFM, whose father, a firefighter, died in the line of

duty in 1974; and Fr. Mychal Judge, OFM, a friar who lived at the Holy Name Province and served at Siena for many years. Fr. Mychal was the FDNY chaplain who became the first certified fatality of the September 11,

2001 attacks when the South Tower collapsed as he was praying for victims. Siena College posthumously bestowed the degree of Doctor of Humane Letters upon Fr. Mychal Judge, Order of Friars Minor in 2002.

Four additional bells were gifted to the St. Rose of Lima Church in Newtown, CT in remembrance of the children and teachers killed at Sandy Hook Elementary in 2012.

The Class of 2020 Senior Gift will contribute funds used for the Bells of Remembrance to be brought to and displayed on campus. This space will be a beautiful gathering place (at this time a space near the Siena Grotto is being examined), and the bells can be rung for significant occasions at Siena. In honor of their generosity, a plaque with all of the leadership donors (\$100+) to the Class of 2020 Gift will be placed to recognize the Class and its contribution to Siena.
