- Students transferring with 24 or more credits are not required to complete Siena's First Year Seminar (6 credits), however, check with Siena admissions for acceptable substitutions.
- Students are required to complete four Franciscan Concern courses in the areas of diversity, heritage, nature, and social justice. These courses can be taken at HVCC and transfer into Siena.
