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This outline should be used for those transferring from HVCC into the Siena College Philosophy major.

Points to keep in mind:

- Grades of C or better will transfer.
- Any 300-level course must be taken at Siena or another four-year accredited institution.
- Half of your major must be completed at Siena College.
- Students transferring with 24 or more credits are not required to complete Siena's First Year Seminar (6 credits), however, check with Siena admissions for acceptable substitutions.
- Students are required to complete four Franciscan Concern courses in the areas of diversity, heritage, nature, and social justice. These courses can be taken at HVCC and transfer into Siena. - Substitutions for courses may be made by the Siena College Assistant Deans where they deem appropriate.
