Siena College offers programs for which professional license or certification can be obtained to practice or gain employment within their field of study after graduation.

It is our responsibility to students to provide information for our educational programs with curricula that meet requirements for licensure and certification. Information is available below for students review from four states where over 90% of our student population is located: New York, Connecticut, Massachusetts, and New Jersey. We will continue to research, and review our programs for licensure and certification requirements and provide the information for the remainder of the states.

Requirements for licensure vary from one professional to another, from state to state, and they are subject to change at any time. If you are considering an academic program that leads to a professional license in your state, it is highly recommended that you contact the appropriate licensing agency in your home state BEFORE beginning the academic program located outside your state.
